SIMPLIFIED EXPLANATION OF LAWS 37.1 – 37.3 and 38.1 - 38.3

- If a bowl in its original course or a jack or bowl in motion or at rest, is displaced by a player on the rink of play –keep in mind when making a decision –
‘You offend, I amend’.
- If a jack or bowl in its original course or in motion or at rest, is displaced by a neutral person or object – the jack or bowl is either replayed, or, replaced to its former position by agreement between the skips or opponents in singles and if they can’t agree the end is declared dead.
Displacement by a neutral person or object – agreement between the skips and if they can’t agree the end is declared dead.
- If a bowl in its original course, or a jack or bowl in motion, is displaced by a rebounding non-toucher – it is placed where the skips or opponents in singles agree it would have come to rest.
If the skips cannot agree on the final position, the end is declared dead.
- If a jack or bowl at rest on the rink is displaced by a rebounding non-toucher, (note – not a neutral object or person), an opponent or the marker replaces it to its former position.
